Strong Local Support for the Arts –a yearly investment of notional & purchased salaries at approximately \$476,000 and another \$48,000 spent on resources for programs and events each year - \$672 per year per student goes towards performing arts at Whitfield SS. Our school community 'speaks with their feet' with the huge support they display in encouraging their children to participate in programs and in attending performances and getting children to the numerous practices and rehearsals.

Community Infrastructure Gap - Currently there are no large community hall or performing arts centres within this local area including Whitfield, Kamerunga or Brinsmead suburbs. A community asset such as a performing arts centre would be very likely to be extensively used by a wide range of community groups. The siting of the building in the master plan was considered to support this external access. 90 seat purchased and planned childcare centre directly opposite our campus will also impact stronger enrolment growth trends.
